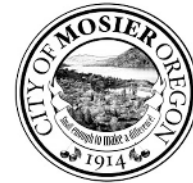


MINUTES

CITY COUNCIL MEETING

SUMMARY: The Mosier City Council meeting covered updates on recycling programs and stormwater management initiatives, with presentations from various coordinators and discussions about nature-based solutions for handling stormwater run-off. The council reviewed draft stormwater management plans and discussed code adoption processes, including the development of best management practices and native plant lists for the city. The conversation ended with discussions about community initiatives, including food security efforts and infrastructure concerns, along with updates on Union Pacific's construction plans and their impact on local parks and facilities.

OPEN MEETING

Public Comment - None

- Wasco County Presentation:** Christina Fiebig, the Tri-County Hazardous Waste and Recycling Solid Waste Coordinator, presented an update on the program's activities and introduced new recycling guidelines, emphasizing the importance of reducing contamination. Mayor Anderson suggested posting the briefing materials on the council's website to help residents understand the new recycling rules.
- Stormwater Master Plan Update:** Jody Behr, of YSM Solutions, presented a draft stormwater management plan to the council, outlining nature-based solutions to address non-point source pollution in Mosier. The plan, funded by a DEQ grant, aims to mimic natural water cycles and reduce pollutants in local creeks. Jody explained that all developed land in Mosier would be encouraged to comply with the plan's requirements, which focus on public right-of-way, commercial, and industrial land. The council was given an overview of the plan's organization and benefits, with Jody noting that questions could be directed to her, City Manager Andrea Rogers, or Special Projects Coordinator Colleen Coleman for further clarification.

The presentation included designs for roadside swales and planting plans, as well as recommendations for water quality testing and educational outreach. The team discussed the

next steps for codifying the plan into City code, with Willamette Trust agreeing to write the code at no cost. Colleen noted that the plan is due by December 31st, and Jody requested council's support to continue working on it. The group also considered involving additional agencies like ODFW in the review process.

Jody emphasized the importance of community involvement and explained that feedback is needed within two weeks. Mayor Anderson raised concerns about the cost implications of best management practices for developers, while Councilor Charlie Cannon suggested creating a coalition of neighboring communities to adopt similar policies. Special Projected Coordinator Colleen Coleman explained that while Mosier has jurisdiction over its own watersheds, they can coordinate with other agencies and neighboring cities. The council agreed to review the report and provide feedback, with Colleen noting that the final code adoption timeline would depend on completing the plan by December 31st and working with DEQ for an early 2024 timeline.

3. **Proposed Code Enforcement Procedure:** The council reviewed a proposed code enforcement process developed by Laura and Colleen, which outlines steps for handling complaints and violations.

4. **City Activities Updates/Reports:**

- City Manager Rogers and Councilor Ron Wright: Discussed Union Pacific's upcoming work in Mosier. Ron and Andrea provide updates on potential impacts and access issues. The council explored options for compensation from UP for lost park access and considered long-term solutions like a pedestrian bridge.
- Councilor Brenna Campbell: Met with residents in the area to address food insecurity in Mosier.
- Councilor Gary Lindemyer: Raised questions about water truck usage at fire hydrants, which City Manager Rogers addressed. Gary also noted that a meter attachment was located to assist in billing for bulk water usage within city limits.
